Hoof Beats

n October 11 2017, members of the ERL team (assisted by the monetary donations from the rest of the team), saved the lives of equines destined for slaughter. Among them was a pregnant mare we named Valiant. Val was in horrible condition, suffering from a severe upper respiratory infection, malnutrition, parasite infestation and overgrown teeth and hooves. This frightened, defensive mare had not received proper care in a very long time, if ever. She was immediately examined by our veterinarian, Dr. Raymond Hyde, DVM, and started on antibiotics and anti-inflammatory medications. Val and the others were dewormed upon arrival to PKF.

Not knowing any history on these animals, we assumed Val would foal in the Spring; however, she delivered a very healthy, strong colt exactly one month from her rescue date. It was a 16-degree night in the wee hours of Veterans Day. Because of the generosity of people like you, our members and donors, both Val and her son, Honor are healthy, fat and well. They continue to thrive under the superlative care they receive at PKF.

A gallant Draft Mule and a lovely Quarter Horse mare, named Ferris and Jessie respectively, were also saved that day. Both have been placed into very qualified, loving homes.

All of these animals were cramped in a dark and dirty barn waiting to be hauled to Canada or Mexico to be slaughtered for human consumption. My friend, Jessie's adopter, shared with me her favorite quote: "saving one horse will not change the world...but surely it will change the world for that one horse."

With your donation we can and we will continue to properly care for and place into loving, qualified homes these gracious victims of abuse and neglect. Thank you for helping us help them!

arch of this year, the US House of Representatives and the Senate Appropriations Committee passed the Omnibus spending bill, which includes the hard-fought provisions that will continue the ban on domestic horse slaughter and protect wild horses and burros from mass killing at the hands of federal agencies. So we thank our legislators for this action, knowing that with the next spending bill, the fight begins again. Continuing to defund USDA inspections at horse slaughterhouses will keep those facilities closed.

Even though the last horse slaughterhouse in the U.S. closed in 2007, more than 100,000 equines are transported each year to slaughterhouses in Mexico and Canada, under horrific conditions, to meet a painful and terrifying death.

At livestock auctions across the country, adoptable equines like the very pregnant Val, the affable mule Ferris, and the lovely and sound Jessie (very rideable), are sold to undisclosed "kill buyers" (the middlemen to foreignowned slaughterhouses) who bid against rescue groups and legitimate owners and rob horses of the opportunity to have a 2nd chance at life. To end the export of equines for human consumption into other countries, a bipartisan bill called the Safeguard American Food Exports, (S.A.F.E.) Act was introduced in 2017. Myth

Horse slaughter is a form of humane euthanasia.

"Euthanasia" is defined as a gentle, painless death provided in order to prevent suffering. Horse slaughter is none of those things. See: https://www.aspca.org/animal-cruelty/horse-slaughter

Fact

We have no other options, in the immediate future, for the horses currently going to slaughter each year.

The following is based on USDA reports and documentation:

- 92% of horses sent to slaughter are in good condition and therefore able to live out productive lives. These horses could go on to good homes; however, many good owners and rescuer operations are outbid by slaughter buyers at their local auctions.
- Less than 1/100th of the entire horse population will require the help of equine sanctuaries or humane euthanasia.
- For the small number unable to find a home or enjoy a good quality of life, a licensed veterinarian can provide humane euthanasia for the same cost as one month's care for that horse.
- As a safety net, there are approximately 700 horse rescue organizations across the country, with new ones forming all the time, leading the charge to ban horse slaughter and actively working to provide humane solutions for horses.



Bubba's Tack Shack, which opened at Promise Kept Farm October 2015, has raised over \$5000 to help equines saved from slaughter, like our beloved Bubba. Ten percent of the sale proceeds go into a fund where individuals or organizations who have rescued equines from slaughter can request a grant to cover that animal's immediate care needs. The remaining sale proceeds are directed towards the daily operating fund at Promise Kept Farm.
